

Learning Management System Rural NEPA Physicians

I. Purpose

The Learning Management System (LMS) is a web-based system for training programs and information sharing regarding bioterrorism and public health issues. Authorized individuals have 24/7 access to the LMS. Users are given access through the URL: www.pahealthinfo.net and are assigned a unique User ID and Password.

II. Benefits

- CME accreditation of courses
- Access to training at home or on the job.

IV. Authorized Users of LMS

Each person will be assigned a unique User ID and password.

In addition, Users will be placed in subgroups based on criteria for reporting and content specialization.

The User will need a computer, access to the Internet and a 56K modem to participate. The User need not use the same computer each time he or she accesses the site.

V. Features

The LMS has the capability to track overall User progress, evaluate program content, score tests, and create certificates. In addition to the course content there will be:

- An information library
- Course evaluations (Tests)
- Program content surveys
- Discussion groups
- Conferencing for up to 50 people
- File exchange capability

With the LMS, experts in the field of public health preparedness and related activities will be available to end users via web based training programs.
